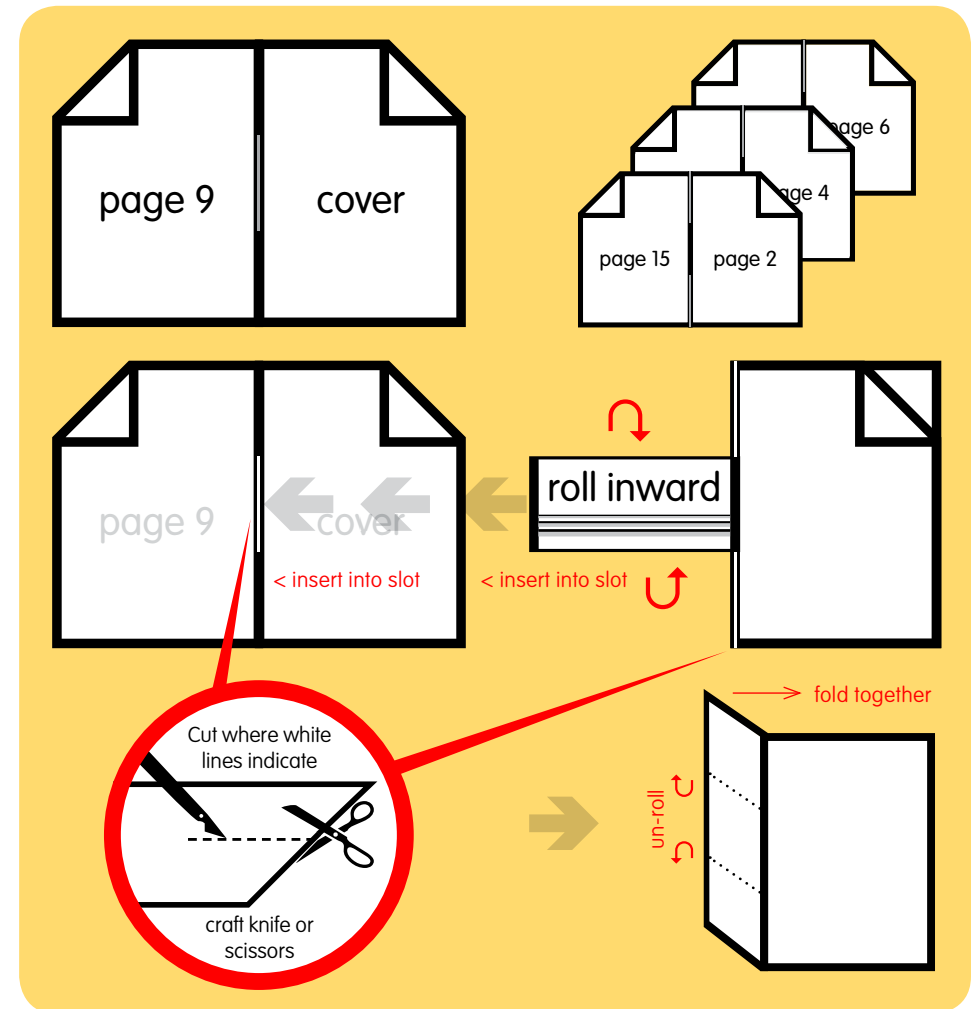

Putting the *Book of Chronicles* together

- 1) Print your document double sided on either a printer or photocopier, e.g. page 9 and cover (front), page 1 & 8 = 4 pages.
- 2) 4 A4 sheets make-up 16 pages (printed both sides and folded).
- 3) Cut a slot down the middle of **page 9 & cover page** as marked below in diagram 1.
- 4) Cut slots marked by grey dashes on pages 15 & 2, 13 & 4, 11 & 6.
- 5) Roll both ends of pages 15 & 2, 13 & 4, 11 & 6 toward the centre (careful not to crease).
- 6) Slide into centre slot of page 9 and cover.
- 7) Unroll then old book in half.

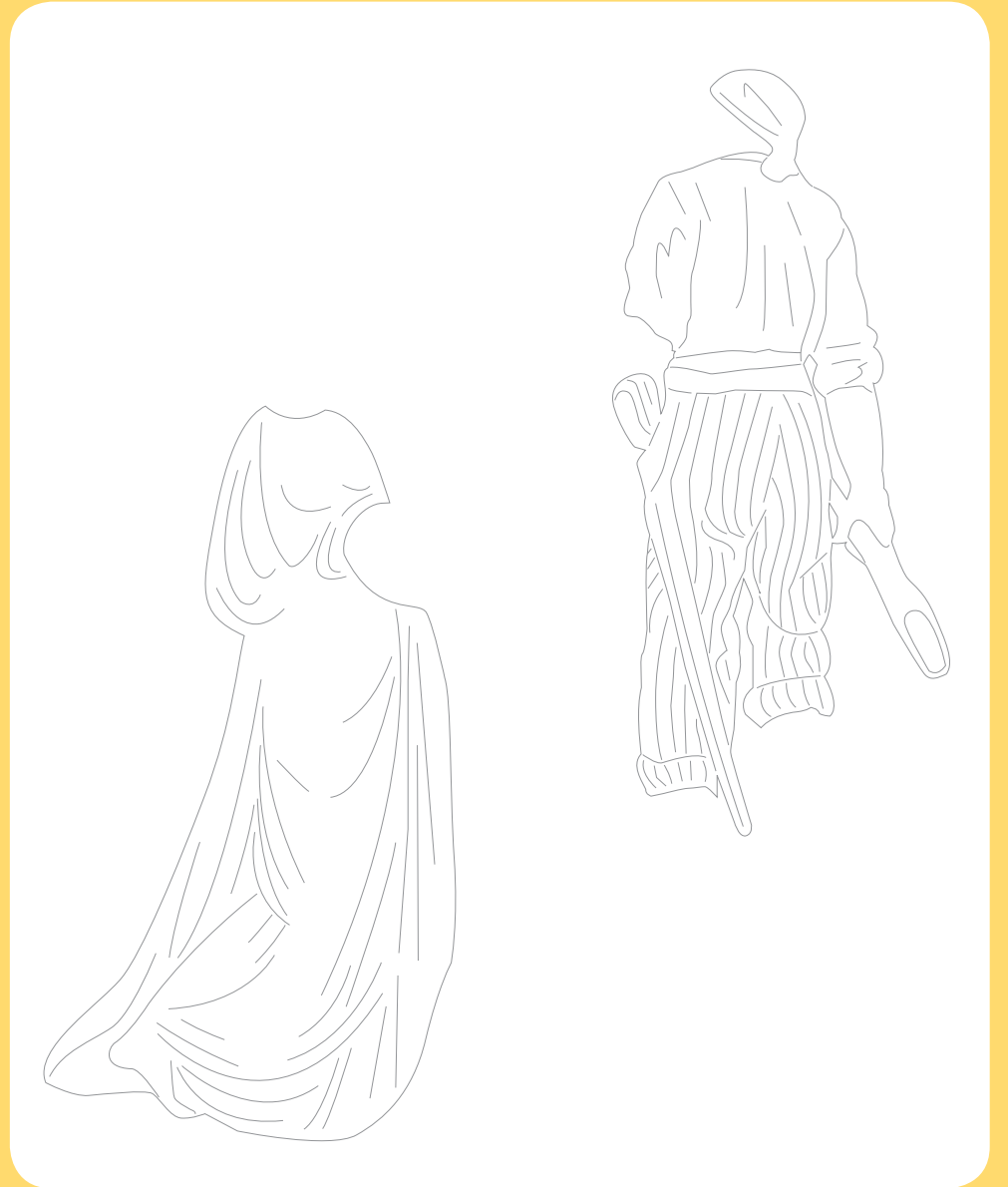
The *Book of Chronicles* was made in Germany in 1493.

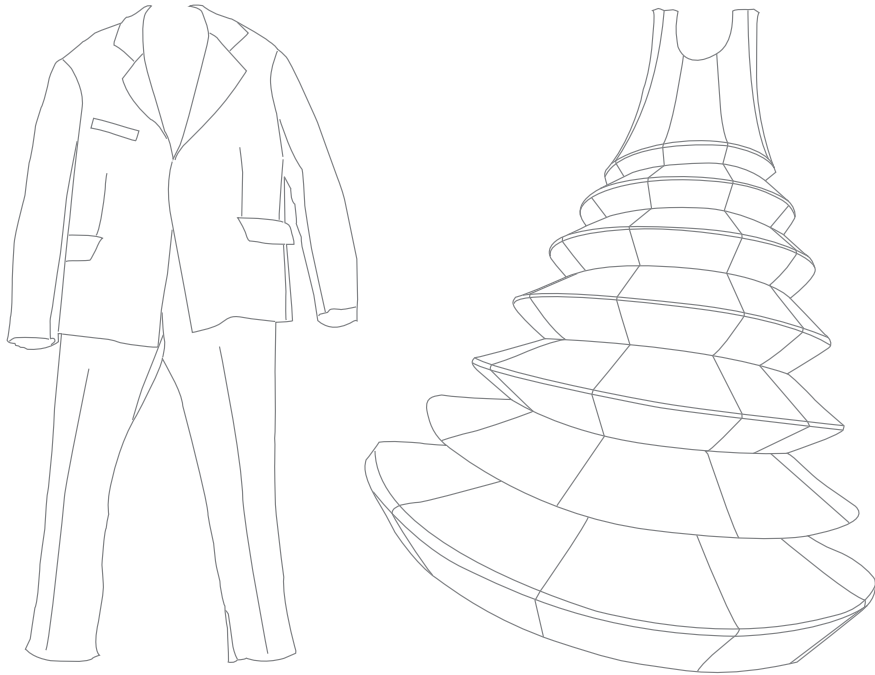

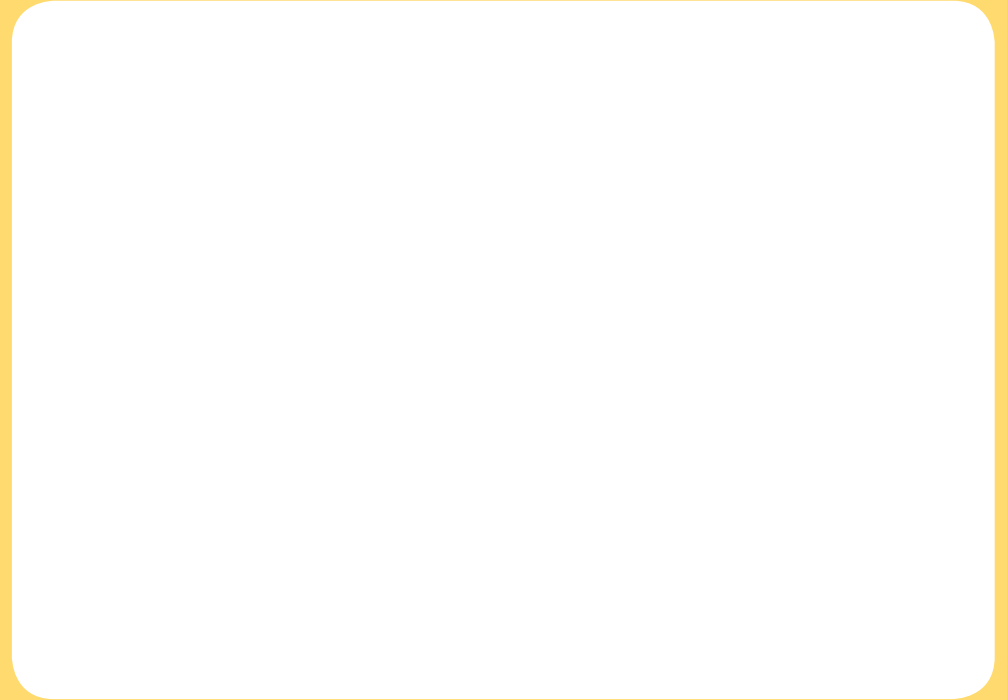
